

Port: Baku, Azerbaijan

Location: Baku is situated on the western side of the Caspian Sea on the Apsheronkiy Peninsula. Baku city is situated 40km from the port.

General overview: The port is situated in a natural harbour and serves primarily as a transshipment point for petroleum products and oil/gas related industries, general cargo and timber to Western Europe and passenger services to the E and W shores of the Caspian Sea. As part of Baku port, a new international port is being constructed at Alyat, 65km South of the main port. The new port area is regarded as a vital transportation hub for trade, linking the West (Turkey & EU), South (Iran & India) and North (Russia). Three international rail routes into Azerbaijan, converge at Alyat: To the NW, passing through Baku to Russia; to the West, passing through Georgia to the shores of the Black Sea and Turkey and to the South, to the border area with Iran.

Traffic figures: Approx 4,400,000t of cargo, 20,500TEU, 10,700 passengers and 1,300 vessels handled annually.

Max size: Azpetrol Oil Terminal: Draught 7.2m, 13,400DWT.
