

Port: Jacksonville, USA

Location: Jacksonville (Jaxport) is located in NE Florida, the city being situated on St John's River some 24nm from the Atlantic Ocean.

General overview: The Jacksonville Port Authority (JAXPORT) is a full-service, international trade seaport in the Southeastern United States. JAXPORT owns and manages three cargo terminals and one passenger cruise terminal in Jacksonville, Florida. These include the Blount Island Marine Terminal, the Dames Point Marine Terminal, the Talleyrand Marine Terminal and the JAXPORT Cruise Terminal. Exports: Include paper products, phosphate rock, fertilisers, chemicals, citrus products, naval stores, tallow, clay, scrap metal, feeding stuffs and general cargo. Imports: Include petroleum products, coffee, iron and steel products, limestone, pulpwood, cement, vehicles, lumber, chemicals, alcoholic drinks and general cargo.

Traffic figures: Approx 9,330,000t of cargo, 1,000,000TEUs, 1,700 vessels and 180,000 passengers handled annually.

Max size: Max draught 11.5m. Largest vessel handled by size: "Cape Sounio". LOA333.3m, Beam 48.2m, 134,869DWT. 11,000TEU. Arrival draught 11.1m (Actual draught 16m). Largest vessel handled by TEU: "Kota Pekarang". LOA330m, Beam 48.2m, 132,672DWT. 11,923TEU. Arrival draught 10.6m (Actual draught 16m).
