

Port: Providence, USA

Location: Providence, Rhode Island, is situated at the head of Narragansett Bay, 23nm from the open sea and also includes the terminal at Quonsett/Davisville, also known as North Kingstown, which is located approx 8nm from the sea buoy.

General overview: The port of Providence is comprised of many terminals. One of which is the privately-owned marine terminal known as ProvPort, which occupies 42ha along the Providence River. Its facilities include an "on-dock" rail system with three rail spurs, 8ha of open lay down area and 27,870m² of enclosed warehouse space. Primary imports at the terminal include petroleum, asphalt, cement, LPG, coal, aluminium oxide, project/heavy cargoes and salt. Primary exports include scrap metals, automobiles and project/heavy cargoes.

Traffic figures: Approx 3,500,000t of cargo annually. The ProvPort terminal alone handles approx. 70 - 100 vessel calls annually.

Max size: Draught 12.19m, LOA 251.26m, beam 42.06m, 78,000DWT. ProvPort Terminal has no LOA or beam restrictions.
