



Port: Alexandria, Egypt

Location: Alexandria is situated on the N coast of Egypt, approx 220km from Cairo.

General overview: Alexandria is the principal port of Egypt. It is separated into two harbours by the coke quays and breakwater. The Inner Dock handling general cargo and the Outer Dock handling petroleum and bulk cargoes. The harbour is formed by two converging breakwaters, with the entrance channel being 400m in width. There is a free zone area within the port. The principal exports are agricultural products, cotton, onions, garlic, rice, groundnuts, citrons, fruit and cotton yarn. The chief imports are agricultural products, tea, grain, coal, coffee, timber, tobacco, industrial products, machinery and motor vehicles.

Traffic figures: Approx 57,000,000t of cargo, 700,000TEU, and 4,000 vessels handled annually.

Max size: LOA 294m, beam 38m, draught 12.8m, 150,000DWT.
