

Port: Aqaba, Jordan

Location: Aqaba lies at the southernmost tip of Jordan on the NE shores of the Gulf of Aqaba.

General overview: The Port of Aqaba, which is the only access to the sea for Jordan, is located on a 40km strip of coastline between Israel and Saudi Arabia. The main areas of the port are: The main general cargo port, the Passenger and Container Terminals (approx 3nm S of main port), the New Oil Exporting Jetty (approx 8nm S of main port) and the Fertiliser Industry Terminal (approx 9nm S of main port), close to the Saudi border. The principal exports are phosphates, tar products, cement, and fruit. Imports include general cargo, building materials, grain and machinery.

Traffic figures: Approx 27,000,000t of cargo, 800,000TEU, 2,000 vessels and 400,000 passengers handled annually.

Load line zone: Tropical.

Max size: LOA 370m, draught 24m, beam 50m, 400,000DWT
