

Port: Piraeus, Greece

Location: Piraeus lies on the Saronikos Gulf towards the SE of the mainland.

General overview: It is the major port in Greece and is the port for Athens, handling most cargoes and large number of cruise/ferry passengers. The port complex consists of three sectors: The Passenger Port (Central), The Commercial Port (Hercules/Drapetsona), handling liquid cargo, containers and vehicles, and The Ship Repair Zone (Perama). Imports include coal, petrol, oil, timber, metal and industrial products. Exports include cement, tobacco, fruit, cotton, skins and grapes.

Traffic figures: Approx 14,000,000t of cargo, 4,907,908TEU, 17,000 vessels and 15,000,000 passengers are handled by the port annually.

Max size: Cruise vessels: draught 18.0m. Container vessel (by DWT): "COSCO Shipping Sagittarius". LOA399.729m, Beam 58.6m, 202,133DWT.
